

## How to use Score Sheet R20

**Correct Server** This is the single hardest thing for a ref to know immediately

Fortunately we have an indicator that immediately identifies the correct server

uses a clip with 1 on one side and 2 on the other to identify **server 1** or **server 2**

uses the same clip to instantly identify the correct server

works equally well for teams that play same side of court for all serves (stacking)

uses the wrist **BAND** to identify the **STARTING SERVER** for each team

Printed on the score sheet is

Team \_\_\_\_\_

The Ref fills in the players names in **no specific order**

**Player1-F-Name Player1-L-Name, Player2-F-Name Player2-L-Name**

Draw **Circle** around **STARTING SERVER** for each team

Make sure to orient score sheet properly on clipboard, **clasp always points to serving team**

**Once the clip is set at side out and re positioned on second serve**

**It will always be over the player serving, Starting Server or Partner, Band or No Band**

**The score determines the correct service court and correct receiver court**

**End of Every Rally** - Ref Says one of 3 things:

**Point, Second Serve, Side Out**

**Point – Action:** Mark Score, / thru score if server 1 is serving, \ if server 2 is serving

**Second Serve – Actions:** Turn over clip so 2 is showing, place clip over other player on same team

**Side Out – Actions:** Vertical Line after last score, rotate clip board placing new serving team on top, move clip to top of clip board with 1 showing, place over correct server according to serving team's

**SCORE:**

**EVEN** score – place over **circled player (Starting Server)**

**ODD** score – place over **non-circled player (Partner)**

CHECK server and receiver for correct court positions per their score, partners can be anywhere

On end change during the game

**Copy** 1 or 2 from clip and write **under player name the clip is over**, remove clip

rotate sheet on clipboard (this maintains the sheet's orientation to the clasp after end change),

reset clip over player where you wrote 1 or 2

verify server and receiver are correct and in correct positions

When reffing outside The Villages, bring your clip(clothespin type provided), stopwatch (usually none provided), extra pencils (just in case)

Their score sheets are a little harder to use than ours and are mandatory for Certification. Be sure only Starting Server name is circled. Take care when marking side out lines to make sure they are clearly visible next to boxes lines. TO boxes have TO # printed inside box. Not easy to mark score legibly inside TO box, so practice

I prefer our score sheet. Larger font, greater line spacing, TO boxes are empty, no boxes around scores, room to write TW or TF after TO's. All in all, more ref user friendly.
